Safety Topic

John Haight gave a short talk about Contact Dermatitis (Wood dust). He explained the symptoms, gave a list of woods that cause it and how to prevent it.

Question/Answer time

Mary Scanlan wanted to know what she should do about a bowl scraper that she sharpened that created a catch. Clyde Holverson suggested she hold the tool in a "Negative Rake" position (holding the tool with the nose cutting edge angled down). She also asked what to do about overly dried Norfolk Pine that she tried to carve but crumbled. Suggestions were to turn it green or presoak it in Pentacryl.

Roger Nank wanted to know what Friction Polish was. Grant Barlow explained that it is a wax for shining pens.

Jim Gabor asked how to clean Anchor Seal from a natural edge bowl. Suggestions were to use Orange Cleaner, acetone, or just put the Anchor Seal on the end grain and not the entire bowl.

Byron Bohnan asked if Elmer's glue mixed with water works like Anchor Seal. Lyndal Anthony said to check the wood in 6 month and let us know how it worked.


